THE HOLBERG INTERNATIONAL MEMORIAL PRIZE is awarded annually for outstanding scholarly work in the fields of the arts and humanities, social sciences, law and theology. The prize is worth NOK 4.5 million. The Laureate of 2011 is Jürgen Kocka, German Professor of History.

THE NILS KLIM PRIZE is awarded to a younger Nordic researcher within the academic fields of the Holberg Prize. The prize is worth NOK 250 000. The Laureate of 2011 is Jørn Jacobsen, postdoctoral researcher at the faculty of law at the University of Bergen.

THE HOLBERG PRIZE SCHOOL PROJECT is a research competition for students in Norwegian upper secondary schools. The Holberg Prize wishes to contribute to greater understanding, interest and enthusiasm for research in the academic fields covered by the prize.

THE HOLBERG PRIZE was established by the Norwegian Parliament in 2003. It is named after Ludvig Holberg, the famous Norwegian-Danish playwright and scholar. He played an important part in bringing the enlightenment to the Nordic countries.
